DMIRS APPROVALS PERFORMANCE REPORTING (Mining and Petroleum) – September Quarter 2022

The implementation of the DMIRS **Approval Response Plan** during the September quarter, resulted in an improved performance for Programme of Work, Mining Proposal and Native Vegetation Clearing Permits applications. Programme of Work performance was 57 per cent compared to 22 per cent in the June quarter. At the time of publishing this report, the Programme of Work performance had achieved 85 per cent. Mining Proposal performance improved slightly to 45 per cent (41 per cent June Quarter) and Native Vegetation Clearing Permit performance improved to 45 per cent (27 per cent June Quarter). Petroleum tenure and Petroleum Environment Plans performance was 40 per cent and 79 per cent respectively. Mining tenure performance continued to achieve performance targets with 93 per cent of Prospecting and Exploration Licence applications finalised within target. Ninety six per cent of Mining Lease applications and 84 per cent of Miscellaneous Licence and other tenure were finalised within target timelines.

The DMIRS performance objective is to finalise 80 per cent of applications within the target timeline.

Departmental performance is measured against a range of administrative and statutory targets. For example, the DMIRS target for finalising a mineral exploration "Programme of Work" application is 15 business days. Key approval targets are listed in the appendix of this report. The "speedo" dashboard graphic represents our performance against each approval type for the guarter.


This report incorporates new information, reflecting industry feedback. There is more emphasis on total timeline information as this assists mineral and petroleum companies plan for exploration and development activities. The average total timeline is the time taken in the assessment process by DMIRS, the proponent and, where applicable, other government agencies. Other agency input may be required for complex applications, particularly if access is required to culturally important or environmentally sensitive areas. The segment titled "parallel processing" shows the number of overlap days where an application was on hold for both the proponent and another agency.


Most mineral and petroleum tenure applications are subject to the requirements of the Commonwealth *Native Title Act 1993*. These applications include a four-month notification period (around 80 business days) prescribed under S29 of the *Native Title Act 1993*. This period is included as part of the "Other agencies" component for mineral and petroleum tenure applications.


The report provides detailed information about the number of received, finalised and open applications. This provides exploration and development activity trends over time and the number of open applications awaiting finalisation by the department.










Exploration Licence










Mining Lease
