



Proposed sand pits – Myalup

Request for Expressions of Interest (REOI) to extract basic raw materials at Myalup Stage 3 site

The Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety (DMIRS) is calling for Expressions of Interest (EOI) for the extraction of sand, and possibly limestone, from two adjacent sites of 62ha and 77ha respectively at Myalup located between Mandurah and Bunbury.

The sites are to the north, off Johnston Road, in the Shire of Waroona, and are located over the Spearwood Dune System that is up to 60m high.

The Minister for Mines and Petroleum will consider the EOI submissions and may select two suitable entities to each be invited to apply for a mining lease and, for one, a related miscellaneous licence for the purpose of a road.

The areas, over part of Myalup State Forest, are under juvenile pine plantation and will be released under authority provided by Section 19 of the *Mining Act 1978*.
