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
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
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MINERAL PRODUCTION MAJOR CENTRES

OVERVIEW

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MINERAL AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTION TRENDS:

Introduction

The value of Western Australia's mineral (and petroleum) production increased by \$800 million during 1988. This increase raised the total value of output to over \$7.0 billion, a rise of 11.0% on the \$6.3 billion total for 1987.

Gold, nickel, diamonds and mineral sands were the outstanding performers in terms of total value of production. Most of the sector increases were generated by international market price rises.

Downward price movements, particularly in crude oil and natural gas, resulted in output values below those recorded in 1987. For most of the commodities in the latter position rising production mitigated price falls.

With existing capacity levels and firming prices, the mining industry is well placed to register sustained growth through 1989.

Gold

In 1988 the total value of gold production was \$1.9 billion.

This figure represented a 16.5% increase over the previous year's record. With this increase, gold surpassed iron ore as Western Australia's most important mineral commodity.

The rise in value of output was achieved despite a decline to \$US439.81 per ounce in the year's average monthly gold price. The equivalent monthly average price for 1987 was \$US446.36 per ounce.


Production rose from 78.4 tonnes in 1987 to 107.2 tonnes in 1988. Thirty three new mines, each with a potential output in excess of 100kg per annum were commissioned during the year.

These new mines, plus significant development work and throughput capacity increases on existing projects, generated the tonnage rise. Significant capital expenditure was undertaken during 1988 at the Boddington, Telfer and Marvel Loch projects.

Production looks set to continue rising in 1989 with major investments in new mines and plant capacity due to come on stream. Some of the latter are the Granny Smith, Mt Hope, Labouchere and Rothsay operations.

It is projected that statewide production of gold will be in excess of 130 tonnes in 1989. If the world gold price continues to drift lower, an increase in net output during 1989 could be accompanied by some industry rationalization as producers seek to lower costs.

Iron Ore

Iron ore production increased from 84.12 million tonnes in 1987 to 98.31 million tonnes in 1988. This represented a 16.8% increase in output. Despite this significant overall rise in production, the total export value of Western Australian iron ore increased only marginally.

Iron ore prices have been depressed since the early 1980's recession and subsequent period of over supply on world markets. As the demand for steel has steadily risen, particularly during the past 18 months, there has been upward pressure on iron ore prices.


Negotiations with Japanese steelmakers have yielded price rises for 1989 of 17.3% for lump ore and a 13.0% increase for fine ore. The demand driven price increase is projected to be sustained and this has positive implications for development and production planning in the Western Australian industry.

1988 saw the first expansions in capacity for several years. Three new operations - Mt Newman's Marra Mamba (June 1988), Mt Goldsworthy's Nimmingara (December 1988) and Hancock Mining's McCamey's Monster (February 1989) - are expected to boost Western Australia's iron ore capacity by 8 million tonnes per annum.

In addition to these major projects, mine development work by existing producers will result in a considerable expansion of

output during 1989. The extra capital formation and operating expenditure commitments are strong evidence of producer confidence in the industry's future.


Alumina

The quantity of alumina produced in Western Australia rose from 5.92 million tonnes in 1987 to 6.17 million tonnes in 1988. This represented a 5% increase for the year.

The value of this production was \$1.3 billion in 1988, up from \$1.1 billion in 1987.

This outcome was due to the 40% increase in the world aluminium price during 1988 beginning to flow through to alumina prices. These developments place Australia, and particularly Western Australia, in an ideal position to take advantage of a strong consumption growth in the East Asian markets. Western Australia currently produces 25% of the world's alumina. Planned project expansions, together with increased demand from the East Asian region, should see Western Australia's alumina producers recording sustained growth through to at least 1989/90.

Petroleum

Ten Western Australian oil fields were producing in December 1988: Barrow Island, Harriet, North Herald, South Pepper, Mount Horner, Dongara, Blina, Lloyd, Sundown and West Terrace. These oilfields produced approximately 2.1 million kls of oil in 1988. This represented a 12.5% increase on the 1987 production of 1.76 million kls.

Natural gas output from the State's five producing fields was 3.6 billion M³, a 200 million M³ increase over the 1987 total. This expansion was largely due to increased production from the North West Shelf.

Condensate production in 1988 totalled 1.1 million kls. This represented a 21.7% increase on 1987's output of 0.92 Million kls.

Despite these increases in production the value of the petroleum sector output declined from \$776.18 million in 1987 to \$693.79 million in 1988. This was largely as a result of the fall in world oil prices during 1988.

The lower oil prices led to a 21.8% drop in the value of Western Australian oil production from \$314.91 million in 1987 to \$246.06 million in 1988. Natural Gas output value fell 7.5% from its 1987 total of \$325.88 million to \$301.42 million in 1988. Condensate production increased by an amount which was sufficient to overcome

a nett price fall. The resulting value of production rose 9% from the 1987 figure of \$135.42 million to \$146.25 million in December 1988.

The Western Australian petroleum sector is expected to register strong growth in 1989 as a result of the following factors. Firstly, crude oil prices are projected to stabilise at the \$US17 - \$US20 per barrel level. Also, the \$3.7 billion investment in the LNG phase of the North West Shelf project is scheduled to begin earning export income in mid 1989.


Future output prospects for the petroleum sector will also be boosted by the commencement of two major projects during 1989.

The first of these, Saladin, should reach maximum output during the year. Onsite construction of production facilities for the oilfield began in March 1988. It is expected to come on stream in October 1989 at a rate of approximately 8 000 kls per day. This capacity gives Saladin the potential to be the largest oil producing field in Western Australia.

The second, Talisman is located in an area of Commonwealth jurisdiction beyond the Territorial Sea, and is to begin production in July 1989.

Exploration investment is set to increase again in 1989, with exploratory drilling of 39 onshore and 11 offshore wells.

Nickel


The value of Western Australian produced nickel concentrate rose again in 1988 to \$480.84 million. This was a gain of over 60% on the 1987 figure of \$294.15 million. The rise in value for the year was accompanied by a fall in nett production. The 1987 total of 416,152 tonnes of concentrate declined to 337,723 tonnes in 1988.

The steady increase in world price from mid 1987 through 1988 benefited the industry by considerably expanding the nett value of existing reserves. The record price level achieved in 1988 is shown in the graph below.

Expenditure on exploration, development and production have, for most of the past decade been constrained by the low market price of the metal.

A sustained price climb through 1988 augers well for the future of the industry. Western Mining Corporation have, during 1988, acquired and begun the rehabilitation of the extensive Agnew Mining venture at Leinster. Another relatively high grade deposit at Rocky's Reward is being developed by the Corporation to provide feedstock for the Kambalda refinery.

NICKEL PRICES: \$A/tonne





Mineral Sands

The mineral sands industry in Western Australia enjoyed substantial growth during 1988. The value of production increased to \$328 million, a rise of 33% on the 1987 total of \$246 million. An outstanding increase of 78.6% in the value of zircon produced was the major contributor to the overall rise for 1988.

Advanced feasibility studies and the commencement of several major developments during 1988 confirmed the underlying strength of the mineral sands sector.

The most noteworthy of the proposed developments was the Cooljarloo project, the first mineral sands operation to combine mining and multi-stage processing. Investment in capital works and development is to exceed \$370 million and production is due to commence in 1990.

While new processing facilities were developed at Kemerton (TiO_2 pigment plant) and Rockingham (zirconia plant), new mines are proposed for Waroona, Jangardup and Eneabba.

The rise in World demand for the products of mineral sands has led to an increase in exploration activity. Expenditure has risen steadily over the last five years, from \$0.80 million in 1982/83 to \$2.45 million in 1987/88.

Throughout 1989 world demand is projected to remain high and prices stabilise at current levels. Western Australia's extensive reserves and expanding production capacity will ensure the State remains the world's premier producer of heavy mineral sands.

Diamonds

Western Australian diamond production rose from 30.33 million carats in 1987 to 35.22 million carats in 1988. This resulted in a robust 22.7% rise in the value of production, from \$246.51 million in 1987 to \$302.49 million in 1988.

Producers can look forward to increased production values in 1989. This will be a result of the announced 15% diamond prices rise due to take effect from April 1989.

During 1988, exploration activity in the north of the State has been extensive, with more than 20 companies engaged in preliminary surveys. It was, however, the developing demand on world markets for smaller stones (0.02 - 0.05 carats) which drove capacity increases by existing producers.

The most recent Kimberley area diamond mining venture is the construction of a pilot plant at the Mt Elizabeth project in the Phillips Range. This major investment by Freeport/Triad Minerals is indicative of the region's high level of prospectivity.

Summary and Outlook

Overall, 1988 was a year of steady growth for the Western Australian minerals sector. Most commodities recorded increases in terms of both value and quantity of production.

Gold and iron ore had to overcome price falls to register increases in the value of production. Despite an increase in value of condensate production, the petroleum sector was unable to make up for the price falls in crude oil and natural gas.

Another factor which negatively influenced the value of exported mineral products was the steady rise in the \$A/\$US exchange rate during 1988. As most mineral contracts are denominated in \$US the 21% increase in the \$A value eroded posted price gains.

The fact that the minerals industry recorded an overall increase in value of output, is a good indication of its flexibility and fundamental strength in the face of changing market conditions.

A continuation of strong demand in prime areas of consumption will place a solid floor under most base metal prices. These areas are the transport and construction sectors of the Western European, Japanese and North American economies.

Gold output is set to expand markedly during the next 12 months as a result of long run investment decisions by producers. These developments will occur despite a continued easing of the precious metal's price on world markets.

Finally, the petroleum sector is anticipated to perform better in terms of sharply increased exploration activity, firming of prices and the commencement of the North West Shelf's LNG project export phase.




1983 VALUE OF PRODUCTION



1988 VALUE OF PRODUCTION



TOTAL : \$ 105.7 MILLION



TOTAL : \$ 178.5 MILLION


